

Neues Schloss (New Castle)

With the New Castle, Duke Carl Eugen von Wuerttemberg (1744 – 1793) had the last large Baroque residence castle facilities in Germany built. He demanded from the city and the Wuerttemberg representatives of the orders that they built a “proper residence which is convenable to his royal dignity and the amplitude of his royal household” because he wanted to make Stuttgart to a second Versailles.




Stuttgart's Palace Square is the vibrant heart of the city, but at the same time it's a place linger, within easy walking distance of many of the city's attractions.

Stuttgarts best viewpoints

Birkenkopf – Monte Scherbelino Stuttgart

70197 Stuttgart

The Birkenkopf is a 511-m-high hill in the urban area of Stuttgart – the most elevated point within the inner-city zone. Standing almost 300 m higher than the R. Neckar, it offers spectacular views! Between 1953 and 1957 the hill "grew" by about 40 metres: around 15,000,000 cubic metres of debris resulting from World War II were deposited on top of it. On its summit one can still recognise the remains of the façades of many ruined buildings. This is why the hill is known to Stuttgart's inhabitants as "Monte Scherbelino" ("Mount Rubble").

Santiago-de-Chile-Square

At Santiago de Chile Square Stuttgart lies at your feet: this scenic lookout in Degerloch can be ideally combined with a ramble through the vineyards – or a ride on the "Zacke" rack railway!

Karlshöhe

The Karlshöhe ridge, with its vineyards, gardens and public green areas, lies between south and west Stuttgart. Double enjoyment: The beer garden on the panorama terrace of Stuttgart's Karlshöhe serves tasty snacks and drinks – ideal for a short break from the daily grind!

Bismarkturm Stuttgart

Am Bismarckturm 36, 70192 Stuttgart

One of the best views over the whole of Stuttgart: visitors willing to climb the 92 steps up to the platform of the 20-m-high structure are rewarded with a fantastic 360° panorama. Endowed in the year 1904 in honour of the statesman Bismarck by the students of what was then the College of Technology, the renovated tower stands on the Gähkopf hill in the north of Stuttgart, overlooking the Feuerbacher Heide park.

Killesberg Tower

The Killesberg Tower in Stuttgart's Killesberg Hill Park may look rather fragile, with its steel cables and filigree stairs – but it's sturdy enough to bear the weight of its visitors! And even to sway them gently to and fro as they enjoy the view from its upper platform.
